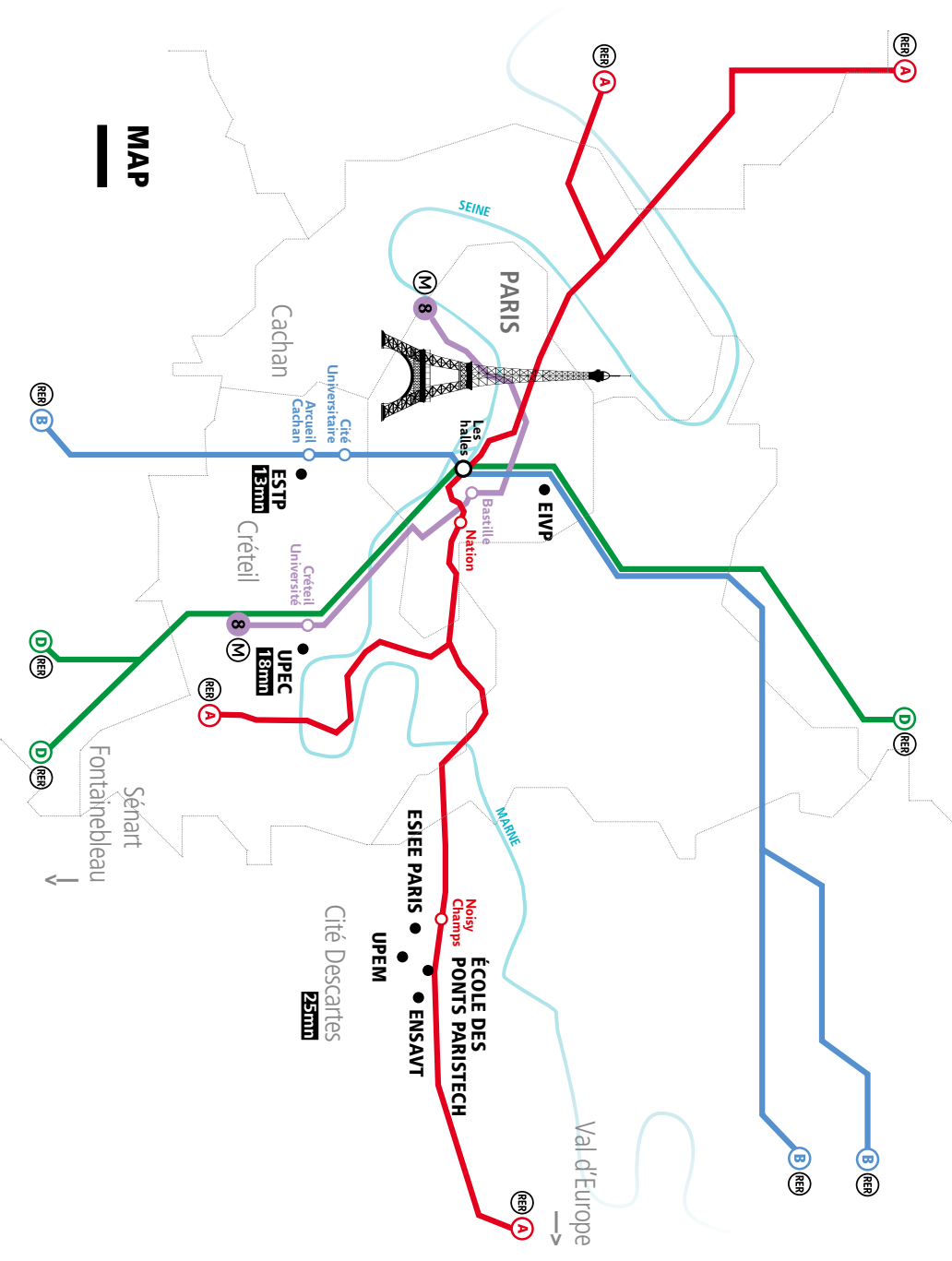
EIVP

I SPEAK AND I LEARN FRENCH

A basic level of French is a factor of success. The «*advanced intermediate*» level (B1, B2) is recommended for anyone wishing to enter one of the establishments

of Université Paris-Est (UPE). All UPE establishments will help you in this process: upon arrival, you can take courses in French as a foreign language (FLE).

I CHOOSE MY TRAINING

BACHELOR, MASTER, DOCTORATE

Training provided within establishments of the **Université Paris-Est (UPE)** is based on the **LMD system**: bachelor, master, doctorate (PhD). These 3 diplomas are recognized at the national and European levels.

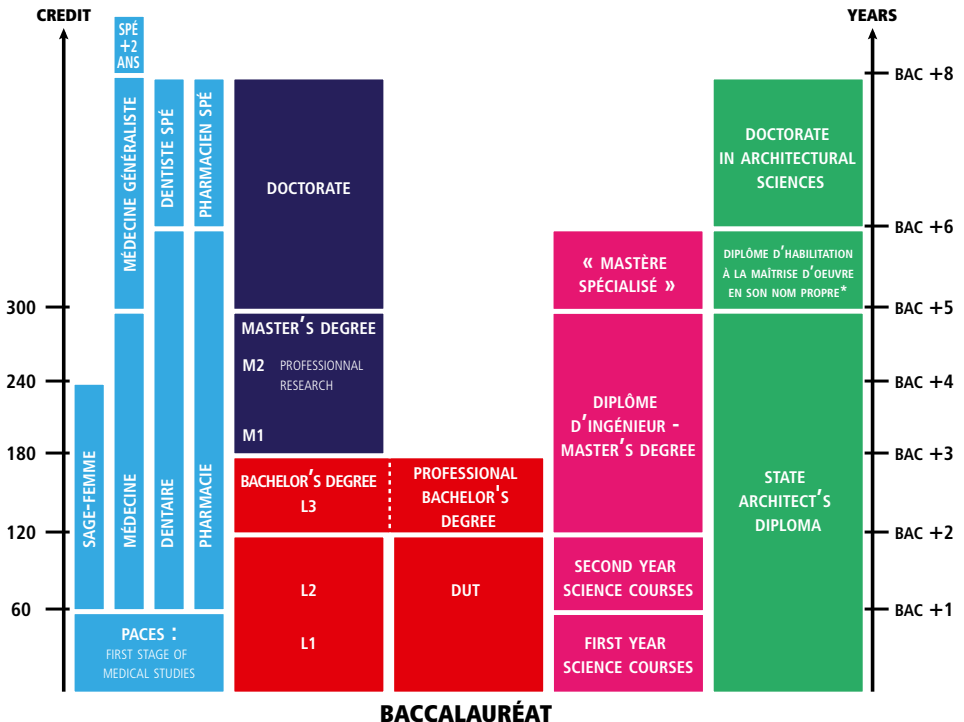
Advanced masters (Bac+6: 6 years of higher education) and MBA's are offered by some establishments.

These degrees are converted into ECTS credits (European Credit Transfer System), which represent a «European exchange currency» for students. This system allows you to earn credits during your stay

in our universities and have them validated in all European universities.

The three levels of training (bachelor, master, doctorate) are classified in four large fields (*arts, literature and languages; human and social sciences; law, economics and management; science, technology and health*). Short degrees (Bac +2), bachelors and masters are subdivided into areas of expertise (*applied foreign languages, history, international law, biology, etc.*) in order to specify the syllabus followed by the student.

PLANNING MY BUDGET

In order to study under acceptable conditions, you must have adequate financial resources to face the costs of living in the eastern Paris region.

MONTHLY BUDGET

SAMPLE BUDGET*:

Housing (water and electricity included):	€ 500
Insurance (home, public liability):	€ 20 to 45
Health insurance:	€ 30
Food:	€ 200
Transport:	€ 30
Telephone & Internet:	€ 20
School supplies:	€ 40
Hobbies & outings:	€ 40

* This financial estimate will vary depending on your particular situation (your type of accommodation most significant).

BUDGET UPON ENROLMENT



IMPORTANT

Students who must apply for a visa, at the consulate must submit proof of sufficient financial resources to pursue studies in the eastern Paris region.

Additional fees should also be anticipated upon arrival. The first month you will have to pay for:

- Your tuition fees: check the sum and the terms of payment on the website of the establishment you want to study at.
- If you come from a non-European Union country, student social security is mandatory: around € 200.
- The OFII tax (French Office for Immigration and integration): about € 50.
- Upon entering your accommodation, you will need to pay, in addition to the first month's rent, a security deposit equal to one month's rent (excluding taxes).
- Settling in costs (sheets, towels, kitchen utensils, etc.).
- Various sign-up fees (sport, electricity, telephone, etc.).

IMPORTANT

Closing dates for scholarship applications are very early. Many applications must be ready by October/November in order to begin the following September.

COMPLETING YOUR BUDGET: STUDENTS JOBS

LABOUR LEGISLATION IN FRANCE

- **If you come from a country that is a member of the European Union (excluding Croatia)** you can work in addition to your studies, within an annual limitation of 964 hours or approximately 20 hours per week.
- **If you come from another country**, you can work up to 60% of the amount of normal working hours in France, which equates to 964 hours per year or approximately 20 hours per week.
- **If you come from Croatia**, you must apply for a «UE - étudiant - toutes activités à titres accessoires» permit from the prefecture of the department you reside in France.

- **If you hold a short-stay visa**, you must apply for a temporary work permit from the DIRECCTE (Regional Department of Businesses, Competition, Consumption, Labour and Employment) that corresponds to your address in France.
- **If you possess a long-stay visa equivalent to a residence permit**, you must present it to your employer after validation from the OFII (French Office for Immigration and Integration).
- **If you are from Algeria, according to the Franco-Algerian agreement**, you must request a temporary work permit from the relevant DIRECCTE (Regional Department



IMPORTANT

You have the opportunity to work during your studies but this will not allow you to cover all your expenses. A student job can only be considered as supplementary income.



UNDERSTAND

YOU WILL HEAR THE PHRASE «SMIC HORAIRE». This is the regulated minimum wage in France. Its hourly rate varies on a yearly basis, for more information please refer to: www.service-public.fr.

ALTERNATING (OR SANDWICH) TRAINING is structured into alternate periods of acquiring know-how and experience in a company, and periods of theoretical training within a higher education establishment.

THE INTERNSHIP AGREEMENT is the equivalent of an employment contract for internships. It is a document signed by the establishment where you do your studies, the company that hosts and yourself. The internship agreement defines the conditions of the internship: its duration, the remuneration and the social coverage of the trainee.

STUDENT JOBS WITHIN YOUR ESTABLISHMENT

It is difficult to find a student job from your country of origin. Do not rely on this option for obtaining a visa. You can find a student job once in France. The educational establishments regularly offer student jobs - check with the office of student affairs («Service de la Vie Universitaire») to find out more about these opportunities. In addition, job offers are posted on the websites of certain partner institutions. -

ALTERNATING TRAINING (SANDWICH COURSES)

The duration of work in this case will be above the authorized legal limit. You must request a temporary work permit from the DIRECCTE (Regional Department of Businesses, Competition, Consumption, Labour and Employment) that corresponds to you.

DOING AN INTERNSHIP AS PART OF YOUR STUDIES

If you do an internship, its duration is not counted as part of the authorized 964 working hours (or 822.50 hours for Algerian students), so you do not have to apply for a work permit.

FINDING ACCOMMODATION

PROCEDURES YOU SHOULD KNOW



IMPORTANT

Identify the precise location and means of access to your educational establishment and search for accommodation that is preferably nearby. Limiting your commuting time is advantageous for your studies.

TIPS

Please note that it is much more comfortable to have accommodation arranged and secured before your arrival. Be sure to ask your host institution about the accommodation services it offers.

BEFORE TAKING POSSESSION OF YOUR ROOM OR APARTMENT:

You must sign a lease. This agreement, commonly called a «bail» in French, contracts the tenant and the owner (be it an organization or an individual). You must be a signatory to such a rental agreement in order to receive

government housing assistance. Rent is usually paid at the beginning of each month. **You should ask for a receipt, called a «quittance de loyer», from your landlord to justify the payment of rent.**

3 PRECONDITIONS ARE REQUIRED FOR SIGNING A LEASE:

1/ Organizations and individuals who rent rooms require guarantees, which can be either:

- **a guarantor (or sponsor):** a person residing in France, who has been paying taxes in France for more than 3 years and has sufficient income to pay for your rent if you stop doing so;
- **an upfront payment of the total sum of all monthly instalments** upon entry into the property.

2/ A security deposit, or «caution», that usually corresponds to one month's rent. This money deposit will be returned to you within the 2

months following your departure from the dwelling, after verifying that you have left the property in the same state in which you received it. The owner is entitled to withdraw from this sum the amount necessary for carrying out repairs in the event of damages.

3/ As a tenant, you must imperatively subscribe to a home insurance policy that covers the risk of fire, water damage, theft, etc. - known as a «multirisques habitation» policy. Student credit unions and banks offer this type of insurance policy. Inquire at the time of student registration or when you open a bank account.

DIFFERENT HOUSING OPTIONS

UNIVERSITY RESIDENCE

Accommodation in residence halls fills up quickly in the eastern Paris region, with demand greatly exceeding supply. Often well located, university residences offer lower prices. Identify the residences that are near your place of study. Then put together your application form online through the CNOUS website, starting January 15th: www.cnous.fr.

Warning: very few places are available; do not wait until the last minute.

FLAT-SHARING

Known in French as «colocation», this type of accommodation consists of sharing an apartment (or a house) with others - be they students, artists or employed workers - and thus split the rent. Many ads are posted on specialized websites.

PRIVATE STUDENT RESIDENCE

You will find lots of offers for renting rooms in private residences, published on the websites www.adele.org and www.fac-habitat.com. They offer the advantage of providing a number of services: reception, laundry, cafeteria, common room, etc.

HOMESTAY

Some people offer rooms in their apartment or house. These individuals are generally more flexible on the guarantees requested, but beware you will not be entitled to government housing assistance. Some families do not ask for a financial contribution but instead request a little work in exchange (caring for children, cleaning, etc.). This solution can be beneficial to all the parties, but there is no regulating legislation. As soon as you move in, you must clearly define the tasks and the number of hours expected from you. There are organisations that do the job of selecting families for you. You have to pay for these services.

IMPORTANT

Accommodation in university residences is mainly reserved for students with scholarships from the French Government and students that belong to an organised mobility programme.



TIPS

If you receive a room on campus, arrive during the week, Monday to Friday, before 16:00. The reception closes at 16:00 during the weekday and is closed the weekend.



TIPS

The individual studio is a good option to pursue if you have family already in France who can visit the apartments for you, present a guarantee, and sign the lease.

BEWARE OF SCAMS!

Never pay the rent in advance before leaving your country.

INDIVIDUAL STUDIO

Directly from an owner or through a real estate agency, you can rent an individual apartment. You will have to pay non-refundable agency fees, called «honoraires».

«TURNKEY» SERVICES

There are associations that offer turnkey services for your installation (housing, banking, insurance, telephone, etc.) and integration (discounts at some restaurants, gyms, beauty salons, etc.). These are private services that you must pay for.

HOUSING ASSISTANCE

You can apply for financial aid to help pay for your accommodation; it will be calculated according to your resources. Housing subsidies are paid by the CAF (Caisse d'Allocations Familiales).

The CAF is a departmental service, so you should address inquires to the CAF of the department in which

you reside. In order to qualify for aid, be a tenant or a flatmate and your name on the lease.

IMPORTANT

When handing in your visa application, pay attention to deadlines during busy periods, especially from July to September!

IDENTIFY A CONTACT

Visit the website of your host institution to identify a contact with whom you can correspond in all matters related to your arrival (enrolment services, international relations department and department of student life). Start by confirming to the host institution your interest in the chosen training programme. If you plan to arrive

later than required by the course calendar, you must also inform your host institution of this. Plenty of «Campus France» centres offer pre-departure sessions. It is strongly recommended that you take part in one of these sessions.

PREPARING MY VISA APPLICATION

DO YOU NEED A VISA?

If you come from a member state of the European Union, you do not need a visa to study in France. If you come from another country, a visa is mandatory.

DIFFERENT TYPES OF VISAS

Before submitting your visa application to the consular authorities, identify in advance the type of visa you should apply for. There are several categories of visa: short-stay visa (less than 90 days), «exam» visa (to take an exam or do an interview), long-stay visa for studies (residence permit VLS-TS), and long-stay visa for scientists and researchers.

DOCUMENTATION

Upon your acceptance by the establishment, contact the French consular authorities in order to obtain a list of the documents required to apply for a visa. We advise you to not wait until the deadline of the visa to prepare your application, because some documents can require time to obtain.

BEFORE LEAVING



I ANNOUNCE MY ARRIVAL

ENSURE MEANS OF COMMUNICATION AND PAYMENT FOR THE FIRST DAYS

Think ahead about having a phone that works in France.

Save your contacts numbers: accommodation, educational establishment, and emergency numbers.

Also make sure that your bank card

allows you to withdraw money from cash machines (ATM's) in France (you will find them in airports and train stations). Otherwise, plan to carry enough cash to pay for transportation to your accommodation. You will find money exchange offices "bureaux de change" at airports, railway stations, and, generally, close to bus stations.

FIND OUT ABOUT RECEPTION SERVICES

Inquire with your host

establishment about reception events that may be planned: welcome day, integration week, etc., and let them know of your arrival.

Also ask about the opening hours for student registration, or even try to get an appointment.

INFORM THE OWNER OF YOUR ACCOMMODATION, OR THE RESIDENCE, OF YOUR ARRIVAL

If you stay at a university

residence: you will receive your key at the reception. Take heed! The reception closes at 16:00 and doesn't open on weekends.

If you stay in private

accommodation: contact the owner and make an appointment to fill in the initial state document of the property and get the keys.

GETTING ORGANIZED

WHAT TO PUT IN MY SUITCASE

While wishing to fit too much into our suitcase, we often forget the basics. In your suitcase you should put:

- One or two adapters for your electrical devices: phones, tablets, computers, etc. Voltages in France are 220 V. Check out your device.
- A bilingual dictionary or a language application can prove especially useful in the early days.
- Appropriate clothing. For information on the French climate, please refer to www.meteofrance.com

DON'T FORGET



IMPORTANT

Do not make passport photos in advance while in your country because they will not be accepted for official documents. You will find photo booths («photomatons») that produce «passport» format photos near your educational establishment, primarily in metro (subway) or RER stations.



GOOD TO KNOW

For European students, there are multilingual birth certificates which avoid having to pay for a translation

IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS

Like all international students - whether European or not, and whether part of an exchange program or not - you will have to perform administrative procedures in France for which you will need a certain number of documents.

Non-exhaustive list:

- **passport or national identity card for members of the Schengen area** (make sure your document is not expired)
- **birth certificate** and certified translation
- **health record** and recent x-rays
- **documentation specifying your health care** coverage in your country:
 - . students from the European Union: forms E111 or E128 or your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)

Whenever you rent a property, you must sign a lease and pay a security deposit. See **Fact Sheet N°2**.

I REGISTER WITH MY SCHOOL

Within the first few days following your arrival, you must register at the establishment where you are going to study («inscription administrative et pédagogique»).

GETTING HOUSE INSURANCE

You need to get house insurance before signing the lease. Student credit unions or your French bank may offer this type of contract.

OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

If you plan to stay for more than 3 months in France, we advise you to open a bank account. Some organizations such as CAF or the public healthcare system will only reimburse you by bank transfer to an account in France. A bank account will also be useful for setting up an automated monthly payment of your transportation charges. Some establishments and associations of Université Paris-Est have agreements with certain banks. Inquire at the office of student administration, the office of international relations, or an association, for a list of

banks to simplify the procedure of opening an account.

PURCHASING CIVIL LIABILITY INSURANCE

This type of insurance covers you in the event that you accidentally cause harm to a third party. It is compulsory in France. Banks and student credit unions offer this type of contract, but make sure you do not pay for it twice.

SIGNING UP FOR HEATING AND ELECTRICITY SERVICES

Upon entering privately rented housing, you must subscribe with an electricity service provider.

TELEPHONE

You can buy prepaid telephone cards. These are advantageous for international calls, however the cost of a national call is very high. You also have the option to take out a subscription package, commonly called a «forfait». There are a multitude of forfaits available. Before signing a contract, find out about the conditions of termination, the cost of international calls, and the charges that apply if you go beyond your package's limits. You can learn more by contacting the leading operators: Free, Orange and Bouygues Telecom (for example).

INTERNET

If your home is equipped for an Internet connection, you can send an activation request directly to the telephone company you have chosen. All companies offer Internet packages. However if your home is not appropriately equipped, an Orange technician will need to install a line, which will implicate additional costs.



IMPORTANT

Pay attention to the conditions of termination for «forfait» packages with a time commitment. These offers can seem very attractive at first glance, but the costs are quite high if you leave before the end of the contract.

EMERGENCY NUMBERS

IN CASE OF PROBLEM

Emergency telephone numbers allow calling emergency services for free, 24 hours a day.

In all cases, in order to facilitate and expedite the processing of your call, make sure you specify these three points:

- **Who you are:** Are you a victim or a witness? Consider providing a phone number at which you will remain within reach.
- **Where you are:** Give the precise address of the place where the services are needed.
- **Why you are calling:** Explain the reasons for your call.

SAMU: 15

The service for emergency medical aid (SAMU) is for obtaining the intervention of a medical team, in a situation requiring immediate medical attention.

POLICE RESCUE: 17

This number can be called to report an emergency to the police.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: 18

The Fire Department number is for reporting a dangerous situation or an accident involving property or persons requiring rapid intervention (fire, gas leak, car accident, etc.).

VALIDATE YOUR VISA

If you are a citizen of a country within the European Economic Area, you do not need a residence permit.

If you are a student from another country, you must validate your residence permit at the OFII (French Office for Immigration and Integration).

You have 3 months as of your arrival on French territory to perform this procedure, but do not wait until the last moment.

TRANSPORTATION

The region of Île-de-France is connected by:

448 train and commuter rail (RER) stations,
302 metro (subway) stations,

MY HEALTH

France has a high-performing health system that foreign students can benefit from.

SOCIAL SECURITY AND PRIVATE HEALTH INSURANCE

Health care coverage is composed of the Assurance Maladie (Social Security), that reimburses medical expenses based on agreed rates (between 35-80%), and the «mutuelle», a supplementary private insurance which complements repayments by between 35 to 100%.

THE ASSURANCE MALADIE

This public health insurance is one of the features of the Social Security. It is mandatory, and it gives you the right to receive partial or total reimbursements of your medical expenses.

STUDENT SOCIAL SECURITY AFFILIATION

It is not mandatory for students from the EU, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland, who must be in possession of form E111 or E128 or the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC); nor for students from Quebec, who must carry form SE401Q106. These students must report to the Primary Insurance Fund (CPAM, for «Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie»)

of their department of residence, where they will be issued a document that should be presented to physicians. Reimbursement claims are addressed to the CPAM.

It is compulsory for all other foreign students under 28 years of age. You will be charged a fee when you enrol. You can choose between two student social security options:

- la Mutuelle des Étudiants (LMDE) www.lmde.fr ;
- la Société Mutualiste des Étudiants de la Région Parisienne (SMEREP): www.smerep.fr.

Students over 28 years of age cannot be covered under the student social security scheme, but can instead benefit from Universal Health Coverage (CMU, for «Couverture Maladie Universelle») if they stay for more than 3 months and are not employed.

LA MUTUELLE

All students under 28 years of age can take out a supplementary health insurance, called a «mutuelle». While it is not mandatory, it is highly recommended. The social security agencies will offer this complementary insurance during registration. One of its greatest advantages is that it entitles you to the «tiers-payant» a system that exempts you from paying the medical expenses in advance, in some cases. It also allows for the reimbursement of hospital expenses.

GOOD TO KNOW

Some of the Université Paris-Est establishments offer their students a health service (a medical centre or access to a network of preventive medicine services called Résus). Inform yourself by referring to the website of your host institution.

RECEIVING MEDICAL TREATMENT

CHOOSING A DOCTOR

In order to get the best reimbursement of your medical expenses, you should choose a primary doctor, called your «médecin traitant», who is in most cases a general practitioner and is responsible for following your medical history.

Choose a doctor near you or near your school.

You must download a form for declaring your reference doctor from: www.ameli.fr («Choisir et déclarer votre médecin traitant», at the bottom of the homepage, under «Vous êtes assuré»). This document must be signed by your doctor and sent to the CPAM of your department. In the event that you need to be seen by a specialist, only your doctor can refer you.

You will be better reimbursed if you follow this «itinerary of coordinated care.» Nevertheless, some specialists can be consulted without going through your reference doctor and without you being penalized. Such is the case with gynaecologists, ophthalmologists and dentists.

Consultation fees vary depending on the subsidized sector. Refer to the website www.ameli.fr before going to a doctor in order to know the price of the consultation and the reimbursement rate for which you qualify.

PHARMACIES

Medicine is sold only in pharmacies. You will find pharmacies close to all establishments of Université Paris-Est.

Many drugs can only be sold upon presentation of a doctor's prescription. Some common medications, such as aspirin, are available over the counter, but only medicine bought with a prescription will be covered and reimbursed by the Social Security.

Pharmacies are generally open Monday through Saturday from 9:00 to 19:00. Outside these hours, you must go to a pharmacy "on duty out-of-hours" («une pharmacie de garde»). You will find a list of those currently on duty posted on the doors of all pharmacies.

GOOD TO KNOW

It is advisable to keep separate a photocopy of each ID document (both sides) or, better yet, to scan them and save them in a place you can access over the internet (your e-mail, for example). In case of loss or theft, you will thus be able to recover a copy, which will facilitate the renewal process.

IN CASE OF PROBLEMS

I'VE LOST MY BANK CARD

INFORM YOUR BANK AND CANCEL IT IMMEDIATELY!

If your bank card is lost or stolen, immediately call the number provided by your bank when you opened your account.

I'VE LOST AN IDENTITY DOCUMENT

GO IMMEDIATELY TO THE NEAREST POLICE STATION TO REPORT THE LOSS OR THEFT.

You will be provided a provisional identification document allowing you to move freely. You will then need to contact your embassy.

CONTINUING STUDIES



GOOD TO KNOW

Unlike the short-stay visa, you do not have to return to your home country in order to get a new visa. The renewal of a long-stay visa takes place in France, and results in a valid residence permit (VLSTS).



IMPORTANT

Once you obtain the multiannual stay permit, each year you will have to send proof of having passed your exams or admittance for the following year, via a registered letter with acknowledgment of receipt.

ENROL IN AN ESTABLISHMENT

Before beginning any paperwork with the French authorities, you must re-enrol in your school and receive a certificate of registration.

RENEW YOUR RESIDENCE PERMIT

When your first residence permit (VLS-TS) expires, you can get a multiannual stay permit. You need to renew your permit with the prefecture that corresponds to the department you reside in (students residing in Paris must go to the police headquarters).

This new residence permit will be detached from your passport and will be in the form of a plastic card.

The renewal must be made within the two months before the expiration of your current residence permit. As the waiting period varies for an appointment, inform yourself well in advance.

The renewal of the residence permit is subject to verification of attendance during the past academic year: presence at exams, progress in your studies, or coherence of shifts in career orientation.

You will also need to provide proof of financial resources. If you work, this revenue is taken into account.

After verification by the prefecture, you will get a residence permit covering all of your studies, up to 4 years.

I ACQUIRE FIRST EXPERIENCE AT THE END OF MY STUDIES

LEGISLATION

YOU ARE A CITIZEN OF THE EUROPEAN UNION:

You can work freely at the end of your studies.

YOU ARE NOT A CITIZEN OF THE EUROPEAN UNION,

and you hold a degree equivalent to a Master's degree (Bac +5):

- **At the end of your «student» residence permit and after you graduate**, you can apply for a temporary residence permit.
- **You are allowed to seek and take employment** for the duration of your temporary residence permit. If your employment is unrelated to your degree, you are limited to 964 hours (60% of the annual working time).

- **Once you have an employment contract that is related to your degree**, you can work full time. You must receive a wage that is at least 1.5 times the minimum wage.
- **Within 15 days following the signature of your contract**, you must apply for a temporary working residence permit at the prefecture that corresponds to your address.

GET YOUR CERTIFICATE

Consider asking the school for proof of education, your transcripts and eventually your degree certificate (diploma).

LEAVING YOUR ACCOMMODATION

IF YOU ARE IN A FURNISHED APARTMENT,
the notice period is one month.

IF YOU ARE IN AN EMPTY APARTMENT,
the period is three months.

In all cases, send a registered letter with recorded delivery to your landlord or management agency.

TERMINATE YOUR SUBSCRIPTIONS

BEFORE LEAVING, MAKE SURE YOU HAVE PERFORMED THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

To close your bank account,

you do not have a notice period to respect nor do you have to submit any justifying documentation. Send a registered letter with recorded delivery to your bank agency. Warning: if your account is overdrawn, you must correct this situation before closing your account.

If you signed-up for a monthly travel pass,

go to RATP agency to cancel your «forfait» package. If you hired a telephone and/or Internet service, inquire with your carrier on notice periods. All correspondence should be sent in the form of registered letters with recorded delivery.

You also need to terminate your insurance policies (*housing, civil liability*).

You must send a registered letter with recorded delivery to your insurance agency. Find out about notice periods, which vary between organizations.

- **Un justificatif de domicile** : quittance de loyer, facture d'électricité ou attestation d'hébergement et photocopie de la carte d'identité de ton hébergeant.
- **Une photocopie de ta carte d'étudiant** : si elle n'est pas encore éditée, apporte un certificat de scolarité. Tu peux le retirer auprès du service de scolarité.
- **Un dépôt de 15 €** minimum pour ouvrir le compte, en travellers cheques ou en liquide.

COMMENT J'OUVRE MON COMPTE ?

Tu dois prendre rendez-vous avec un conseiller afin de signer ton contrat d'ouverture de compte, appelé également « convention ». À la prise du rendez-vous, demande des précisions sur les papiers nécessaires à l'ouverture d'un compte. S'il te manque un document, tu ne pourras pas signer ton contrat et tu devras reprendre un rendez-vous.



BON À SAVOIR

Il existe deux sortes de cartes bancaires : la carte de retrait qui te permet uniquement de retirer de l'argent dans les distributeurs et la carte de paiement avec laquelle tu peux régler tes achats chez les commerçants. La carte bancaire est payante. Les prix varient selon les agences, de 15 à 40 € en moyenne par an. Pour t'aider à comparer les banques : www.comparer-les-banques.com



LEXIQUE DE LA BANQUE

AUTORISATION DE PRÉLÈVEMENT

Opération par laquelle tu autorises telle personne ou tel organisme à prélever des fonds sur ton compte en une ou plusieurs fois. L'autorisation de prélèvement mensuelle est souvent utilisée pour payer les frais de transport, les assurances, etc.

CARTE DE CRÉDIT OU CARTE BANCAIRE

C'est un moyen de paiement permettant à son titulaire d'effectuer des achats et des retraits d'argent. Il existe deux types de cartes de crédit : à débit immédiat (débit systématique à chaque achat) ou à débit différé (tous les achats sont débités une fois par mois).

CARTE DE RETRAIT

Cette carte, appelée communément carte bleue, ne peut être utilisée que pour les retraits d'argent en distributeur et aux guichets, mais en aucun cas pour effectuer des achats.

CHÈQUE

Le chèque est un moyen de paiement valable 1 an et 8 jours à compter de sa signature. Au-delà, il sera refusé à l'encaissement. Le chèque est généralement utilisé pour payer une caution, un loyer et des factures si tu choisis de ne pas automatiser ces paiements par un prélèvement mensuel.

CRÉDIT

Action par laquelle une somme d'argent est versée sur ton compte. Ton compte est « crédité ».

DÉBIT

Action par laquelle une somme d'argent est prélevée sur ton compte. Ton compte est « débité ».

DÉCOUVERT

Un compte est « à découvert » ou « débiteur » lorsque son solde est inférieur à 0. Le découvert peut être autorisé jusqu'à un certain montant (accord signé avec ton banquier) ou non autorisé. Dans les deux cas de figure, le client paye à la banque des agios calculés au jour le jour.

DISTRIBUTEUR AUTOMATIQUE DE BILLETTS (DAB)

Automate permettant à la clientèle d'une banque le retrait de billets sur leurs comptes via une carte.

INTÉRÊTS DÉBITEURS (OU AGIOS)

Intérêts perçus par la banque sur un compte dont le solde est débiteur. Le calcul des agios est journalier. Par ailleurs, même l'utilisation d'un découvert autorisé donne lieu au paiement d'agios.

OPPOSITION

Opération qui s'effectue sur un chèque ou sur ton compte si tu égares ta carte bancaire. Tu donnes alors l'ordre à ta banque de refuser toute opération de débit.

VIREMENT

Moyen de paiement où tu donnes l'ordre à ta banque de créditer le compte d'un bénéficiaire. Le virement peut être ponctuel ou mensualisé comme dans le cadre du paiement automatisé d'un loyer.

RIB

Relevé d'identité bancaire. Il s'agit de la « carte d'identité du compte » délivrée par la banque et que l'on remet à un organisme pour mensualiser ses paiements (à la RATP, par exemple, pour payer ton pass « Imagine'R ») ou à un organisme pour être dédommagé (la Sécurité sociale, par exemple, pour qu'elle verse tes allocations sur ton compte). On trouve souvent un RIB à la fin des carnets de chèques ou en tête du relevé de compte.

LES DIFFÉRENTS TYPES DE LOGEMENT

LES STUDETTES OU « CHAMBRES DE BONNE »

Elles sont situées au dernier étage des immeubles. Assure-toi d'une superficie d'au minimum 9 m² pour pouvoir percevoir une aide au logement. La douche et/ou les toilettes sont généralement sur le palier, à partager avec quelques voisins.

LE STUDIO

C'est un logement qui ne comporte qu'une seule pièce principale, avec un coin-cuisine, une salle de bain ou une salle de douche et des toilettes.

LE F1 OU T1

Il a une cuisine séparée à la place du coin-cuisine.

Le F ou le T suivi d'un numéro indique le nombre de pièces.

Un F2, par exemple, comporte un séjour, une chambre, une cuisine, une salle de bain ou de douche et des toilettes. La salle de bain, la cuisine, les toilettes, l'entrée et les couloirs ne sont pas comptés dans le nombre de pièces.

LE LOGEMENT VIDE

Le logement peut être entièrement vide ou disposer d'une cuisine équipée. Demande à ton propriétaire de préciser ce terme.

LES TERMES À COMPRENDRE

M² (MÈTRE CARRÉ)

Les surfaces d'habitation en France s'expriment en m². L'indication de la surface est souvent suivie de la mention « loi Carrez » : c'est le nom de la loi qui régit le métrage des surfaces en France.

LES CHARGES

Les prix des loyers sont indiqués hors charges (HC ou HT) et/ou avec charges comprises (CC ou TCC). Les charges locatives mensuelles comprennent à minima l'entretien de l'immeuble et les taxes locatives.

Généralement, ces charges incluent l'eau chaude, mais il vaut mieux demander confirmation. Pour les logements dont le chauffage est collectif, c'est-à-dire géré par le syndicat de l'immeuble, les charges sont plus élevées, mais tu n'auras pas de frais supplémentaires d'électricité.

Pour les logements dont le chauffage est individuel, tu seras chauffé au gaz ou à l'électricité. Une estimation de ta consommation sera effectuée par la compagnie d'électricité et de gaz. Tu paieras une moyenne de 30 €/mois. Un relevé de ton compteur (appareil situé dans ton appartement qui enregistre ta consommation) est effectué régulièrement par un technicien qui déterminera ta consommation réelle.

Tu seras ainsi soit remboursé si tu as avancé une somme plus importante que celle que tu dois, soit tu devras payer un supplément à la compagnie.

LA CAUTION – DÉPÔT DE GARANTIE

À l'entrée dans ton logement, tu devras payer le premier mois de loyer, une caution (équivalent à un mois de loyer hors charges (HC)) et une assurance logement obligatoire.

LA TAXE D'HABITATION

Pense à demander si ton logement est soumis à la taxe d'habitation, ainsi que son montant approximatif. La taxe d'habitation est une taxe annuelle (payable tous les ans) qui contribue au financement des services rendus par la collectivité.

L'ÉTAT DES LIEUX

À l'entrée et à la sortie de ton logement, tu réaliseras un état des lieux. L'état des lieux d'entrée doit se faire en présence du locataire et du propriétaire, lors de la remise des clés. Il s'agit de noter l'état général de l'appartement (propreté, état de l'installation électrique, du chauffage, des murs, des sols, de la salle de bain, de la robinetterie, des toilettes, etc.). L'état des lieux d'entrée et l'état des lieux de sortie doivent être rédigés avec soin. La comparaison de ces deux documents servira de référence pour constater les éventuels dégâts et établir les responsabilités. Le propriétaire décidera sur cette base de te rendre tout ou partie de ton dépôt de garantie à ton départ du logement.

LE DÉLAI DE PRÉAVIS

Avant de quitter ton logement, assure-toi de prévenir ton propriétaire dans les délais fixés par la loi, appelés « délai de préavis ». Le propriétaire sera en droit de réclamer les mois de loyer dus si tu ne respectes pas ces délais. Le délai de préavis est d'un mois pour les logements meublés et de trois mois pour les logements vides. Le courrier signifiant ton départ du logement doit être envoyé en courrier recommandé avec accusé de réception (voir la Fiche pratique n° 5).

LE RÉSEAU EN ÎLE-DE-FRANCE

LE TRANSPORT EN ÎLE-DE-FRANCE

Le réseau régional offre une grande diversité de modes de transport avec, en 2013 : 5 lignes de RER et 8 lignes de train, 16 lignes de métro, 6 lignes de tramway et près de 1 500 lignes de bus, dont 47 lignes Noctilien (bus de nuit). Ce réseau, dense et étendu, te permettra de te déplacer aisément en bénéficiant du forfait avantageux « Imagine'R », réservé aux étudiants de moins de

26 ans. Ce forfait te permet par ailleurs de te déplacer dans toute l'Île-de-France, les week-ends, les jours fériés, pendant les petites vacances scolaires et du 1^{er} juillet au 31 août, sans restriction de zone tarifaire (le plan de transport francilien est découpé en 5 zones tarifaires).

COMMENT PRENDRE LE MÉTRO ? LE RER ?

MÉTRO OU RER ?

Le métro dessert uniquement le centre de Paris et la petite couronne, c'est-à-dire les quelques villes mitoyennes à Paris (Vincennes, Montreuil, Créteil, etc.). Le réseau RER assure la desserte de la banlieue parisienne. Les trains RER sont plus rapides, mais les arrêts sont relativement éloignés les uns des autres. Autre différence, la tarification : le prix des billets de RER est déterminé par l'origine et la destination du trajet alors que le prix du métro est fixe.

- **Une station est une gare** sur une ligne de métro. Dans le RER, tu entendras les deux appellations : gare et station.
- **Une correspondance est une jonction** entre deux lignes de métro qui sont accessibles par des couloirs.

LIRE LE PLAN

Tu dois repérer la station de départ et la station d'arrivée sur le plan. Identifie ensuite la ligne ou les lignes qui desservent ta station de départ et ta station d'arrivée puis conçois ton trajet en fonction des correspondances disponibles. Une fois le trajet visualisé, tu dois repérer le numéro (dans le métro) ou la lettre (dans le RER) et la station terminus de la ligne à suivre. Chaque ligne est par ailleurs identifiée par une couleur, plus facile à repérer de loin.

ACHERER SON TICKET

Tu pourras acheter un ticket de métro ou de RER au guichet des stations ou aux billetteries automatiques. Les carnets de 10 reviennent bien moins cher que les tickets à l'unité.

Un carnet de 10 tickets de métro vaut 13,70 € et un ticket à l'unité vaut 1,70 €. À bord des bus, le ticket coûte 2 € et ne permet pas les correspondances. Les prix des trajets en RER sont variables en fonction de la distance parcourue, mais la règle est la même : privilégie les carnets et tu feras des économies.

TENIR SA DROITE

Une règle spécifique aux couloirs du métro et du RER : si tu ne souhaites pas avancer sur un tapis roulant ou dans un escalier mécanique, reste à droite. Sinon tu te feras rappeler à l'ordre par les voyageurs pressés.

VÉLIB'

Le Vélib' est un système de location de vélos en libre-service simple à utiliser, disponible 24 heures sur 24 et 7 jours sur 7. La première ½ heure est gratuite et le coût de la location supplémentaire te sera facturé. Les stations sont cependant concentrées à Paris et dans sa proche banlieue :

On parle ainsi de « petite » et de « grande couronne ».

LA POSTE

PETITES CHOSES À SAVOIR

BOIRE UN CAFÉ

Si tu commandes un café, il te sera automatiquement servi un « expresso » : un café court.

Si tu souhaites un café dans une grande tasse, commande un « allongé ». A contrario, si tu souhaites un café plus fort, commande un « café serré ».

Un « noisette » est un café avec un peu de lait. Un « café crème » est un café au lait. Un « déca » ou un « décaféiné » est un café sans caféine.

POURBOIRE ?

Les pourboires ne sont pas obligatoires, le service est compris dans les prix affichés. Ils sont néanmoins toujours appréciés !

LOIS SUR LE TABAC ET L'ALCOOL

Il est interdit de fumer dans les lieux publics, l'interdiction s'applique donc aux bâtiments universitaires, aux restaurants ou cafés en dehors des terrasses (certaines terrasses sont couvertes en hiver et accessibles aux fumeurs), dans les couloirs du métro, du RER, etc.

Il est interdit de conduire avec un taux d'alcoolémie supérieur à la limite autorisée. Le taux d'alcoolémie se mesure en gramme d'alcool par litre de sang ou en milligramme par litre d'air expiré. Le taux légal est de 0,5 g par litre, soit 0,25 mg par litre d'air expiré, ce qui correspond à deux verres d'alcool servis dans un bar. Il est par ailleurs interdit d'être ivre sur la voie publique.

LAVERIE AUTOMATIQUE

Si tu es logé(e) en résidence universitaire, celle-ci est généralement munie de machines à laver communes. Peu de studios sont équipés de machine à laver. Tu trouveras des laveries automatiques en libre-service plus ou moins à proximité de ton logement. Les prix varient en fonction des laveries, mais tu paieras en moyenne 3,50 € pour une machine et 0,50 € pour 30 minutes de séchage.
